Dear River Community,

E ARE EXCITED to present this Impact Report celebrating key achievements of the 2021-2022 school year. It was a busy and productive year, and we are proud to have realized many of our goals from the 2020-2025 Strategic Plan. We set our bar high, and because of this we were able to announce the launch of our Upper Elementary Program and add faculty in disciplines new to the School, cement our plans for a new campus, and present and moderate at the International Conference on Cochlear Implants.

This year, we entered into a new era for River, where we can broaden our passion for innovative teaching and learning, inclusion and belonging, and collaboration and growth. In October, we confirmed our first Grade 4 Upper Elementary class for the 2022-2023 school year. We are thrilled to be creating an exemplary project-based curricular approach to Grades 4-6! And, after several years of searching, The River School put plans in motion for the new campus at 4220 Nebraska Avenue, NW. In November, we received unanimous approval from the Board of Zoning Adjustment for a special exception to build the new campus in a residential zone. This was no small feat. Dedicated River supporters testified at ANC meetings, wrote letters, joined us on the new property to speak with concerned neighbors in person, and testified persuasively at the zoning hearing. Special thanks go to our Board of Trustees and especially Rachel Moore Weller and Nicolle Rippeon; parents Katrina Kosec and Dana Bash; alumni grandparent, Congressman Steve Barlett, and alumna, Grace Kowal, who testified at the BZA hearing from her dorm room at Tufts University. This kind of affirmation epitomizes the strength of the River Community.

A highlight of the year was being selected to discuss our most recent research findings regarding language, social and academic outcomes for children with cochlear implants and their hearing peers at *Cl2o22: Emerging Issues in Cochlear Implants* conference held in May in Washington, DC. We have been conducting and publishing longitudinal outcomes research for twenty years, and as we enter into our third decade, River continues to serve as a national model for inclusive education. We often host visitors and professional meetings for both national and international groups who work with children with and without hearing loss. With these interactions, and through our graduate student training program, we hope to assist children, teachers and clinicians in other communities nationally and internationally.

We couldn't accomplish such important work without you, our community. We are grateful for your contributions of time, talents and financial resources. Every gift makes a difference. Together we can continue to fulfill our mission and provide more children an opportunity to benefit from our unique, inclusive program. We see a bright future ahead and look forward to sharing our progress with you. On behalf of the Board of Trustees and The River School, thank you.

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MISSION

River's Expansion

The New Campus: "Under Oak"



During the last 22 years, River's program and service offerings have broadened to include: a full range of clinical services; parent education and support programs; teacher and graduate student training; auxiliary programs for children; and outreach and advocacy efforts. Our current campus serves us well, but it's time for more space to be able to continue growing. Expanding the School will help strengthen our mission and fulfill a promise of our strategic plan: to serve more students from diverse backgrounds in our surrounding community and region.



The new location's close proximity to the Tenleytown metro will help broaden our reach, and the larger footprint will allow us to bolster our enrollment of students with and without hearing loss through Grade 6. Our new home will feature our signature welcoming, light-filled classrooms, with the addition of a theater, ample open and green spaces, and new Arts & Sciences labs for exploration, creation and learning.

Located at 4220 Nebraska Avenue, NW, the proposed new campus is a 2.27acre estate known as "Under Oak," and includes the historic Buchanan mansion built in the 1920s. Our team has designed a plan for the campus that ensures the renovation of the historic house and development of new academic facilities are compatible with the character of the estate and complement the neighborhood. The mansion and several structures (e.g., the pool house, gate house, main garage) on the Buchanan Estate will be retained, renovated and integrated into the new campus. We have also developed landscape design concepts to enhance the natural features of the site and to address neighbors' feedback, particularly regarding streetscape and screening elements.

Upon completion, the new campus will comprise 66,691 square feet, providing more than enough room to increase River's enrollment to 350 students and faculty and staff to 90. Our relocation presents a unique opportunity for River to be part of an existing institutional corridor that is Metro accessible while respecting the surrounding residential community.

A Big Step Forward

On November 3, 2021 we reached a major milestone: The Board of Zoning Adjustment (BZA) voted unanimously to approve our application for special exception. While we encountered neighborhood opposition, our talented and dedicated team presented a clear and compelling case to the BZA during a seven-hour hearing on October 27. With their vote, the BZA approved our plans for a special exception to build a new school campus in a residential zone, allowing us to expand our school and our speech and hearing clinic, Potomac River Clinic. The approved plans include measures to reduce River's impact on neighborhood traffic with a robust transportation mitigation plan.

We engaged in significant community outreach regarding the new campus during the process leading up to the BZA hearing. Many dedicated members of our community have helped to lay the groundwork for our success. Trustee and alumni parent Rachel Moore Weller has been involved from the beginning of our property search, providing invaluable advice, as well as financial and moral support. Chair of the board's New Campus Committee, Nicolle Rippeon, has worked tirelessly with neighbors and current and alumni parents to garner their written submissions and testimony to ANC3E and the BZA.

We look forward to a positive outcome regarding this opportunity and to meeting The River School's goal of providing greater access to our programs and services for more children in the DC area. We are proud of our demonstrated commitment to the neighborhoods of which we are a part, and we look forward to becoming active and engaged members of the Tenleytown community for years to come. **66** As a current River School parent of two children, I am thrilled about the plans for The River School to expand and be closer to where we live. We have been at River for five years, and our children and family have been able to thrive during that time. Grade 3 Highlights

At River, Grade 3 is the culmination of our Elementary curriculum. Third grade themes and projects become increasingly complex and students engage deeply in research, writing, critical thinking and inquiry-based learning–often in teams. As part of their robust academic work, the Falcons took on in-depth projects, visual and verbal presentations and even a self-produced play.

For the Falcon Science Fair, students created hands-on experiments to test their hypotheses, using data collection techniques and statistical analysis skills. Students presented their conclusions at in-class presentations, as well as recorded Prezis.

During a spring Research Fair in the Gym, Falcon 'experts' created displays and shared their findings with parents, faculty and other students. In preparation, the Falcons dedicated weeks to research, note taking, outlining, summarizing, and writing their reports.

Also in the spring, the Falcons were the stars of an original video production, *Spy School*. They developed the concept, wrote the script, designed the set, blocked the choreography, and recorded their production for our community to enjoy.

A much anticipated highlight of the Falcon year is the overnight trip at Camp Horizons. The Falcon Class and faculty chaperones spent two days camping, canoeing, climbing, hiking, and bonding. For many students this can be the first overnight trip they take away from their families. This year, like in previous years, the Falcons returned tired, but full of laughter and newfound confidence.

Embracing Diversity

The River School continues to pursue its anti-bias and anti-racist (ABAR) goals in classrooms, professional development and through the work of the interdisciplinary Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, Justice, and Belonging (DEIJB) Committee. Ensuring an inclusive learning and professional environment remains a core pillar of River's mission. One of our ongoing goals and commitments is to address race, bias, social justice, and community engagement with our students in developmentally appropriate ways.

In 2020, the school launched a multi-year partnership with consultant Dr. Sharon Michaels, an expert in helping schools normalize ABAR within their communities. Dr. Michaels has guided River School faculty, staff and leadership in strengthening its ABAR environment through a series of workshops around implicit bias, microaggressions, race and racism in schools, and designing and implementing an ABAR curriculum. This work set the stage for the summer of 2022 when a group of faculty began work on River's ABAR Playbook to document how to bring antibias education into every age group, and all facets of curriculum and instruction at River. Ensuring that ABAR work is central to our curriculum is an ongoing goal. Faculty continue to examine best practices related to ABAR education and culturally responsive practices, with the framework of the social justice standards of Diversity, Equity, Justice, and Action. Additionally, our Playbook will document how the goals are infused in the curriculum through lessons and activities and will provide a progression of ABAR learning from Preschool through Upper Elementary.



Graduate Student Training at River Enriching Classrooms and Sharing Our Model

The River School provides supervised clinical training to graduate students in Speech Language Pathology, Audiology, Education, Special Education, and Clinical Psychology. As part of their university's program for earning a masters degree, these graduate students work at River alongside our educators and clinicians. During the 2021-2022 school year, we supervised 15 speech language pathology masters students, two education masters students and three doctoral candidates in Audiology.

River has Affiliation Agreements with many universities including American University, Gallaudet University, George Mason University, George Washington University, Georgetown University, Loyola University, Shenandoah University, University of Florida, University of Maryland, University of South Carolina, and Vanderbilt University.

Connecting with Alumni

Our alumni families are a big reason why River has grown to where it is today. Hundreds of families have entrusted us to educate their children and prepare them for the next steps. We are proud of all our alumni who move on to excellent schools and embark on exploring their interests as students, athletes and engaged members of society. We consistently hear from representatives at other schools that our former students excel at problem solving and teamwork, are curious and display compassion.

We conduct events and programs to stay connected to our alumni and to provide the opportunity for them to connect with each other.



Alumni Family Reunion Events



In spring of 2022, we were pleased to resume our in-person Alumni Family events, starting with the 2013 Falcons Dinner for Grade 3 Alumni and their parents. This event was established in 2015 for the 2007 Falcons and has become an annual tradition. In May 2022, we celebrated the 2013 class' accomplishments, and they enjoyed reminiscing about their shared experiences at River. It was like no time had passed as they toured the school, visited their old classrooms and had "Circle Time" with Mrs. Wright. Reuniting as a class before heading off to their next chapters reinforced their ties to River and each other.

Also in May, we were able to hold RiverWalk at Carderock Park. It was our first community-wide event in two years. Hundreds of members of our community enjoyed outdoor activities, games and lunch. At the start of the day, we hosted an Alumni Family Reunion during which past students of all ages visited with each other, teachers and parents.

Alumni Opportunities

We are continually looking for ways to support and stay connected to our River Alumni—we love seeing the amazing things they accomplish! In addition to publishing *Alumni Connections** and hosting reunion events, we have several opportunities for alums to earn community service hours, intern or participate in our Leadership Development Program as part of Camp River. Each summer, alumni can learn leadership skills by enrolling as a Camp Technician, moving on to become a Counselor-in-Training, which then can lead to summer jobs as Camp Counselors or Instructors.

Thanks to more than \$2 million in generous donations to the Harry R. Weller Future Fund, The River School has sought and found a new campus site at 4220 Nebraska Ave. NW. The property, located in the Tenleytown neighborhood of Washington, DC is known as "Under Oak" and includes the historic Buchanan mansion built in the 1920s. A new campus will allow River to expand its reach, educate and serve more children, and have a campus that better serves our curriculum and mission.

Securing River's Future

In 2016, River parent and Board Trustee Rachel Moore Weller established the Future Fund in remembrance of Harry Weller. Harry held River's mission and vision close to his heart and believed it would revolutionize deaf education and shift the paradigm on how we teach language and literacy to all children.
